## **Waterfall Trail**

## **Opossum Creek Falls**

(Oconee County)







Description: This two-hour journey is quite an effort for the 50-foot Opossum Creek Falls, but depending on your spirit of adventure, reaching the falls could rank among your most rewarding waterfall excursions, or the most difficult. Most of the two-mile hike ambles along a pleasant, forest service trail shaded by an assortment of hardwoods and bordered at times by small partridgeberry wildflowers. When you reach the Chattooga River, turn left onto a heavily vegetated path and scramble around rocks and trees for a time-consuming half-mile hike to the base of the falls.

Height: 50 feet

Length of hike: 1.5 miles to the Chattooga River. Another 0.5 mile up Opossum Creek

Time to hike: 2 hours

Difficulty: Strenuous

Creek or river: Opossum Creek

**USGS Quadrangle: Rainey Mountain** 

Directions to the falls:

- 1. From Westminster, drive west on US 76 for 13.3 miles and turn left onto Damascus Church Road (Oconee County S-37-96). Long Creek Fire Station will be on your right after this turn.
- 2. Drive 0.9 mile and turn right onto Battle Creek Road (Oconee County S-37-102).
- 3. Drive 1.9 miles and turn right onto Turkey Ridge Road (FS 755, which is gravel).
- 4. Continue 2.3 miles to FS 755F on the left; park.
- 5. Walk back up FS 755 to the trail on the right and hike about 1.5 miles to the end of the trail where Opossum Creek enters the Chattooga River.
- 6. Turn left.
- 7. Continue upstream on Opossum Creek about 0.5 mile to the base of the waterfall.
