

The Barton Creek Nature Trail is part of our ongoing commitment to environmental preservation. This 1/2 mile, self-guided tour offers visitors the opportunity to explore unique flora and fauna found in the Central Texas Hill Country.


As you stroll along the shaded trail, you'll encounter many common native plants which are clearly identified on plaques. These native grasses, plants and trees are well adapted to the ecological conditions of this area.

Approximately halfway through the trail, visitors will discover the serenity of a spring-fed pool. Please enjoy the natural beauty of the Trail, and for the safety, comfort and protection of others and the trail, please observe the following etiquette:

- Do not trample wildflower meadows
- View and smell the flowers, but leave them for others to enjoy
- Do not climb trees, shrubs, boulders or walls
- Photograph, but do not feed wildlife
- No Smoking

- Stay on designated Trail at all times Children, ages 12 & under, must be accompanied by an adult
 - No alcoholic beverages allowed
 - Use recycling/garbage containers
 - No pets, other than guide dogs
 - Wear shoes and shirts
 - No bicycles
 - Swimming is not permitted
 - Trail is open from daybreak to dark
